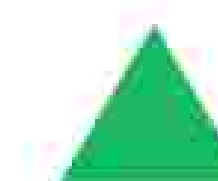

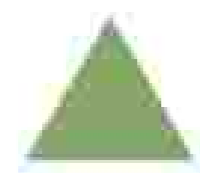

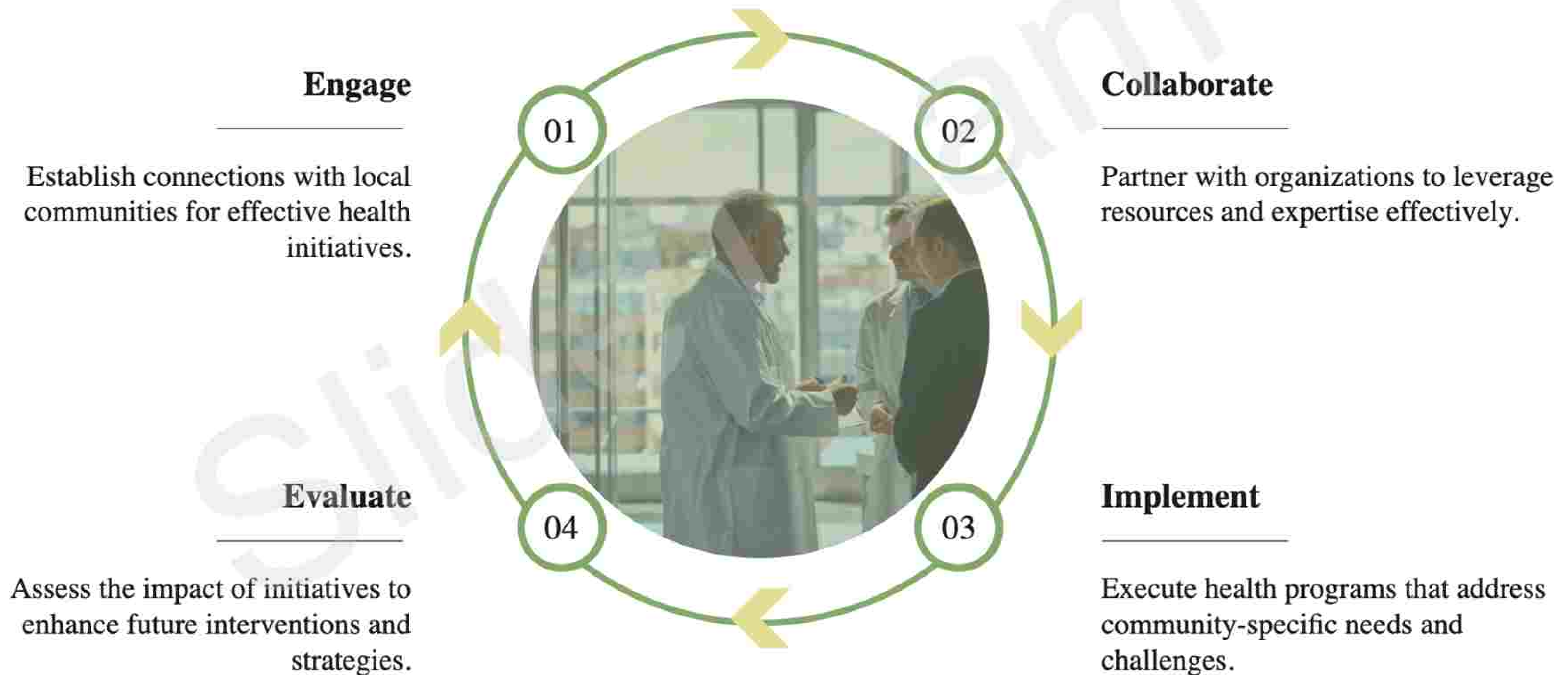


Community Impact Distribution
